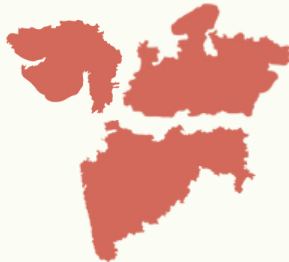

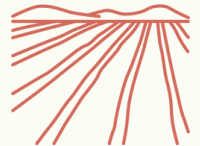

Visit to Bansi Gir Gaushala



Shri. Mayank Gandhi, Shri. Sanjay Parmar, and other Staff members from Global Vikas Trust visited the Bansi Gir Goshala located in Ahmedabad. Bansi Gir Gaushala has developed a revolutionary agricultural probiotic, which distributed to farmers for free. Our team was greeted by Shri Gopal Sutaria, who gave us detailed information about positive effects that the Go Kripa Amrutam (a bacteria culture) has on the soil. They also discussed about harvest patterns after using organic fertilizer, livestock management, and proper administration of a goshala.

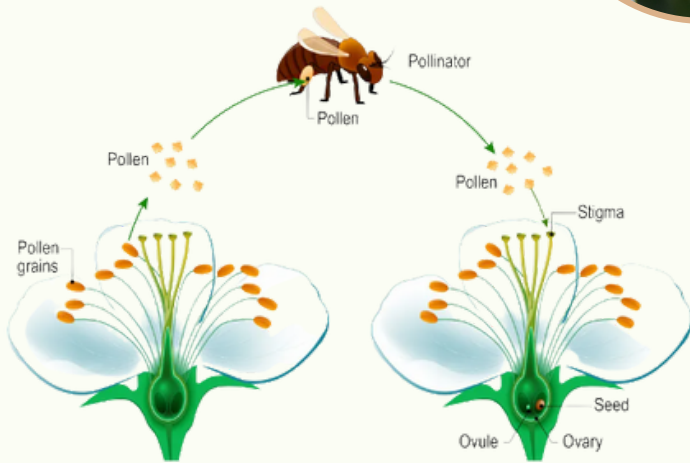
The benefits of Go-Kripa Amrutam were also explained by Shri Gopal Sutariya ji as follows: 1) Friendly micro-organisms are transmitted in the earth - the immunity and quality of the plant increases. 2) Nutrients are available to the vegetation from earth, cow dung and cow urine in simple digestible form. 3) The earth becomes softer - absorbs more rain water - the proof of ground water in the earth increases. 4) The farmer can do cow based farming with self-respect by spending minimum. Farmers from 27 different states in India visited the Goshala and discussed their positive experience with Go Krupa Amrutam, as well as the Mission headed by Global Vikas Trust for fueling rural transformation was highlighted during the discussion.



Pomegranate Pollination

At pomegranate farms, farmers are heavily reliant on honeybees to pollinate their flowers. In order to do so, they attract bees by adding jaggery and honey to a clay pot and leaving it in the fields, right next to the flowers.

The bees are attracted to the flowers, and while getting nectar from the plants, they pollinate the flowers, resulting in a bountiful pomegranate yield.



Satish Varkar - Mixed Crop Farming



One of our star farmers, Satish Varkar from Devthana village, Parli. He has planted a field filled with mixed fruit crops- mango, drumstick, guava, and custard apple land, with an inter-cropping of cotton, jawar, soya, chili, and toor.

He used his 5-acre field very effectively to increase his income, with proper water, fertilizer, and pesticide management. As a result of his efforts, he is earning a profit of 1 lakh per acre every month.

We wish him all the very best for the future.

- 1) How to harden plants
- 2) What is the ideal distance between the plants
- 3) Water and fertilizer management, and prevention of disease and pests.
- 4) Queries on points such as plant quality, planting space, plant mortality, periodic intimations, disease, plant health, pest management, weed removal, and many more were discussed.

Quality Checks

Our GVT Staff Members from Parli ,Vijay Sir and Gulab Sir, visited 'Rise n Shine' at Pune, where they discussed about the selection of banana saplings for distribution to farmers. Quality checks, inspections of healthy roots, and measures to select the appropriate quality of saplings were the key points of discussion.

Preventing Disease in Nurseries

Due to heavy rainfall, there was a chance that plants in nurseries could be affected by diseases, so we took preventive measures by spraying 30-grams of Saaf Fungicide (with stickers) on the saplings prior to giving it to farmers. This ensured that the nursery would be free of disease and pest.

Fungus can prove to be detrimental to the health of plants, and they thrive during the rainy season. Hence spraying fungicide on plants can prove greatly beneficial.
