Opinion

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon. In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information; we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the

preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The boards of directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Company Information

Monarch Networth Capital IFSC Private Limited is a wholly owned subsidiary of Monarch Networth Capital Limited (MNCL / Parent Entity) and shall register with IFSCA as a Fund Management Entity (Retail) and undertake all such activities permissible under IFSCA (Fund Management Entity) Regulations, 2022, including but not limited to investment management activity, portfolio management services etc. The Company intends to achieve medium to long-term capital appreciation through direct and indirect investments globally, in both developed and emerging markets; invest in corporate or sovereign debt, bonds, notes or other debentures, convertible securities (debt and equity), futures contracts (including financial futures), structured and other synthetic securities and related derivative instruments; shall seek to make investments globally wherever opportunities arise.

Note 1: Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention on an accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.

2. **Use of Estimates**

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of estimates, wherever necessary, which have an effect on the reported amounts of assets and liabilities as on the date of the statements and the reported amounts of income and expenditure for the reporting period. The difference between actuals and estimates is recognized in the subsequent period when the actuals are known.

3. Revenue Recognition

Revenue Recognition in the books of accounts has been recognized in the books of accounts in consonance with Accounting Standard - 9 relating to Revenue recognition. However, during the year under review, company has not conducted any business operation.

4. Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

Diluted earnings per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period and adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

5. Taxes on Income

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable in respect of taxable income of the year. Deferred tax for the year is recognized, on timing differences, being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward only if there is reasonable/virtual certainity of its realisation.

The carrying amount of Deferred Tax Assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date and written down or written up, to reflect the amount that is reasonably / virtually certain, as the case may be, to be realized.

6. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the Notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.
